The Contract-Based Health Child and Adult Neuro Rehab Music Therapist provides music therapy interventions to support the medical, developmental, emotional, and social needs of patients and their families in the Pediatric and Adult Neuro Rehab units (Pediatrics, 3ARU, and 4ARU).

Commitment:	Approximately 9 hours per week
Duration:	Based on grant funding.
Location:	Santa Clara Valley Medical Center, San Jose, California
Compensation	\$49-\$69 per hour, depending on certification, skills, and years of experience.
Schedule:	This independent contractor role is expected to require 9 hours per week on-site hours. The contractor may set their own schedule in coordination with project needs, though some evening or weekend hours may be necessary.

- Collaborate with the multidisciplinary team in planning, implementing, and evaluating the music therapy program and quality improvement projects.
- Comprehensive full scope is available upon request, outlining current expectations for patient engagement and group facilitation on the adult rehab and pediatric units; scope is subject to change as program needs evolve.

Contractor Requirements

- MT-BC certified in California
- 3 months of work experience with children and adults.
- Proficient in musical skills, effective verbal and written communication skills in English, use of computer programs, Epic, Word, Excel, MS Teams platforms, and music recording software.
- Master's degree in music therapy
- Basic Life Support certification or ability to obtain within 3 months
- 6 months of work experience with children and adults with neurologic conditions
- Additional language proficiency encouraged; i.e., Spanish, Vietnamese
- A reliable and insured vehicle, along with a valid driver's license.
- Bilingual/Spanish-speaking candidates encouraged to apply.
- Work cooperatively and collaboratively as part of Pediatrics, 3ARU and 4ARU, and VHF teams.
- Maintain confidentiality of information about community members/clients/participants.
- Assist in planning programs of moderate complexity.
