Training for Real Patient Care

Part of great patient care is ensuring healthcare providers have the training tools necessary to excel in their patient work. Thanks to donor support, we were able to purchase "wearable" simulation equipment for Education Services.

This wearable system simulates parts of the body allowing providers to train in multiple scenarios such as listening to heart sounds, catheterization, and other critical areas of care. It provides a "real" opportunity for the learner to interact with a human being as they practice patient-centered care.



Because the equipment is worn by real people, care providers get a more realistic experience and the opportunity to learn not only procedural skills, but also refine soft skills of customer service and interacting with patients on a personal level.

The ability to provide this training to hospital care teams is a defining feature of what donor giving makes possible. This is a victory for patient care and for donors who champion quality care in our Santa Clara County Health and Hospitals System.

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
